
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Título	Walter Benjamin and Gaston Bachelard: the living childhood in us.
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Resumo	Walter Benjamin and Gaston Bachelard: The Living Childhood in Us is derived from a scientific initiation project linked to the research line: Education, Society and Formative Processes of the graduate program in Education, of Universidade São Francisco-USF. It was investigated the childhood poetics of the aforementioned authors, and the permanence of a living childhood in individuals, which serves as a possibility for human beings to start new journeys, start over and change the world around them.
